

Welcome to the SCSO's *Sound and Spirit* Stained Glass performance featuring a program of works from a diverse repertoire linked together in their celebration of sound and spirit. The opening *Mi'Kmaq Honour Song* by Canadian composer and conductor **Lydia Adams** (1953–) is a chant dedicated to and in honor of the Creator. The employment of nature sounds and the call of the human voice honors this tradition of the Mi'kmaq Indians who are a First Nations people indigenous to eastern Canada.

The Renaissance motet *O Vos Omnes* by Tomas Luis de Victoria (1548–1611) represents the epitome of polyphonic art from a great era. The text expresses Christ's words from the cross that display his sorrow just before he gave up his spirit. Victoria was the most famous composer of the 16th century in Spain, and one of the most important composers of the Counter-Reformation, along with Palestrina. Victoria was not only a composer, but also an accomplished organist and singer. He is sometimes known as the *Spanish Palestrina* because he may have been taught by Palestrina.

Following his visit to Uganda in 1984, British composer **Bob Chilcott** (1955 –) composed *The Making of the Drum* to honor the incredible respect and care the Uganda people have for the drum. To them the drum is a living spirit created from animal sacrifice to be reborn and brought back to life as companion to the gods. *The Gong-Gong* assures us of that connection to God when it speaks. Chilcott is often described as "a contemporary hero of British Choral Music". He works tirelessly as a choral conductor and exponent of choral music. In 2002 he was appointed Principal Guest Conductor of the BBC's acclaimed professional choir, the BBC Singers. He also maintains a busy schedule of commissions.

The motet *Sicut Cervus* by Italian Renaissance composer **Palestrina** (1525–1594) was written in Rome for the procession to the Font during the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday. The work compares the spirit of a deer searching for water with mankind's own longing to find the spirit of God. Palestrina has had a lasting influence on the development of church music, and his work has often been seen as the culmination of Renaissance polyphony. For many years, Palestrina was the Director of Music at the Vatican in the 16th century. It will be a privilege for the Sacramento Choral Society to perform *Sicut Cervus* at a special Mass on the Great Altar of St. Peter's in the Vatican during their June 2013 tour.

Contemporary English composer **John Tavener's Mother and Child** celebrates the spirit and miracle of childbirth with the Virgin Mary in her universal aspect as Mother of God, and Sophia, the Eternal Feminine. The large massive chords with organ implies that the real "Mother and Child" are beyond birth and beyond death and beyond being. In 1968, at the age of 24, *The (English) Times* said that Tavener (1944 –) was "among the very best creative talents of his generation." During his career he has become one of the best known and regarded composers of his generation. Tavener was knighted in 2000 for his services to music.



Georg Philipp Telemann (1681–1767) was one of the most prolific German composers from the 18th Century in a generation that included J.S. Bach, Handel, and Scarlatti. Unlike the others, he was mostly self-taught in music and became a musician against his family's wishes. We present three short movements from his *Deutsches Magnificat* (German Magnificat) that demonstrate how his style was very international, writing music that blended Italian, German, and French characteristics. He remained at the forefront of all new musical tendencies and his music is an important link between the late Baroque and early Classical styles.

The text of contemporary Celtic Composer Michael McGlynn's *Media Vita* comes from the early 10th Century and reminds our spirit that in the midst of life we are in death. McGlynn (1964 ~) founder of the Irish choral group *Anuna*, takes pride in adding new musical colors to Celtic traditional music. His harmonic language combines elements of traditional Irish music such as modal melodic lines and ornamentation, fixed and shifting drones and liberal use of jazz-tinged chordal clusters and sonorities.

A similar concept is found in **Selig Sind die Toten** by German Renaissance composer **Heinrich Schútz** (1585–1672). This motet musically expresses those who are at final rest in the Lord, and the Spirit who speaks to them as they rest from their labors. As a composer and organist, Schuetz is generally regarded as the most important German composer before Johann Sebastian Bach and often considered to be one of the most important composers of the 17th century along with Claudio Monteverdi. He wrote what is traditionally considered to be the first German opera, *Dafne*.

Italian composer **Giovanni Gabrieli** (1554–1612) composed **Beata es Virgo Maria** for his collection **Sacrae Sinfoniae** written in the rich Venetian style. This motet from 1597 contrasts the upper and lower voices of the choir to create the effect of two alternating choirs that also combine in full and powerful block chords. Gabrieli was organist at St. Mark's Basilica in Venice. He was one of the most influential musicians of his time, and represents the culmination of the style of the Venetian School, at the time of the shift from Renaissance to Baroque idioms. Gabrieli's work at St. Mark's in Venice made him one of the most noted composers in Europe. Performing this Venetian composer's **Beata es Virgo Maria** in Venice in the historical **Santa Maria dei Miracoli** 15th century church will provide a meaningful opportunity for SCSO Members to create some amazing musical memories this summer while on tour in Italy.

Contemporary American Composer **Eric Whitacre** (1970 –) has developed his own unique compositional sound. He conjures up the image of light and hovering angel spirits in his setting of *Lux Aurumque*. Whitacre is an American Grammy Awardwinning composer and conductor. He is one of the most popular and performed composers of his generation. In 2008, the all-Whitacre choral CD *Cloudburst* became an international best-seller, topping the classical charts and earning a Grammy nomination. In addition to Whitacre's litany of choral and wind ensemble compositions, he is also known for his "Virtual Choir" projects, bringing individual voices from around the globe together into an online choir.

Contemporary British Composer and Organist **David Briggs** (1962 –) is renowned worldwide for his brilliant improvisations. He is Organist Emeritus of Gloucester Cathedral. His setting of the *Sanctus and Benedictus* from his *Messe pour Notre Dame*, display a masterful range of mood and color. There is delicacy, reflection and repose that is evident in his setting of *Ubi Caritas*, alongside mighty bombast and truly gothic "shock and awe" that create a uniquely thrilling musical experience. Heavily influenced by Jean Langlais and Pierre Cochereau, Briggs is regarded as one of the world's finest improvisers, and now works as a concert organist. Briggs is a composer of choral and organ music, and has also transcribed many orchestral works into versions for solo organ.

In the twentieth century, spirituals gained a wide and appreciative audience partly due to American composers René Clausen (1953 –) and Moses Hogan (1957–2003). Deep River and I'm Gonna Sing till The Spirit Moves In My Heart capture the hope and joy of this repertoire in sound and spirit. Clausen's compositional style is varied and eclectic, and put to sacred as well as secular texts. He has created compositions and arrangements that range over many artistic media including choral, orchestral, wind ensemble, film, video, and solo voice. Clausen's most popular harmonies are mostly based on close dissonances such as the major and minor second. Clausen is the conductor of the Concordia Choir in Moorehead, Minnesota.

Hogan, an African-American composer and arranger of choral music, is perhaps best known for his settings of spirituals. Hogan was a pianist, conductor and arranger of international renown. His works are celebrated and performed by high school, college, church, community, and professional choirs today. His most famous work today is *The Oxford Book of Spirituals* created in 2002.

Veni Sancte Spiritus by American composer **Morten Lauridsen** (1943 –) is the buoyant fourth movement of his 25-minute *Lux Aeterna* written in 1997 for the Los Angeles Master Chorale. It is a spirited, jubilant canticle which begins with praise and moves into supplication. Lauridsen's' *Lux Aeterna* is in five movements set to various Latin texts about light. It is a poignant, modern requiem rich in unashamed consonant harmonies and lush haunting melodies.

A National Medal of Arts recipient in 2007, Lauridsen was composer-in-residence of the Los Angeles Master Chorale from 1994–2001. Referring to Lauridsen's sacred music, the musicologist and conductor Nick Strimple said he was "the only American composer in history who can be called a mystic, (whose) probing, serene work contains an elusive and indefinable ingredient which leaves the impression that all the questions have been answered." The SCSO is proud to have recorded Lauridsen's Lux Aetera both in Budapest, Hungary at the Franz Liszt Academy (Radio Hungary recording) and at the Walt Disney Concert Hall in Los Angeles during their June 2008 performance debut.

Organist Ryan Enright's postlude (recessional piece) *Prelude and Fugue in C Major* (BWV 545) by J.S. Bach (1685–1750) illustrates Bach's interest in amalgamating the organ prelude and fugue with the three-movement Italian concerto. The work is passed down both as a straightforward prelude and fugue (in several slightly different versions) and a three-movement (fast-slow-fast) concerto-like format. The music for all three movements seems to have originated in Weimar, but it continued to undergo transformations into the Leipzig years.

The concise but effective *Prelude*, with its instrumental idiom and motoric rhythmic pulse, shows the early influence of Vivaldi. The *Fugue* is based on a white-note, *alla breve* theme that Bach treats in a masterly four-voice manner.

MUSIC DIRECTOR

DR. DONALD KENDRICK

Since 1985, Dr. Donald Kendrick has worked diligently to create awareness of the power and importance of the choral and choral orchestral art via three important pillars in our society: the Community, the State, and the Church. His impact as an educator and conductor has greatly enhanced the quality of life in our region and has resonated on a national and international level.



Dr. Kendrick has studied at the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago, Boston's New England Conservatory of Music, Stanford

University, and he holds a doctoral degree from the Eastman School of Music where he also served on the faculty. He is active as a guest conductor and an adjudicator for choral festivals throughout the country. Dr. Kendrick has taught at Louisiana State University, the University of the Pacific Conservatory of Music, and at universities in Canada where his choirs won national competitions for their excellence.

In 1996 he became the founding conductor of the Sacramento Choral Society & Orchestra (SCSO), the only chorus among the 12,000 community choruses in the United States to have a collective bargaining agreement with a professional orchestra. The SCSO regularly presents choral orchestral concerts in Sacramento at the Community Center Theater, Memorial Auditorium, and the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, as well as in Davis at the Mondavi Center. Under Dr. Kendrick's leadership, the SCSO has produced five professionally mastered CDs and has a unique KVIE PBS documentary that is now being shown nationally throughout the United States.

In May 1995, he made his Carnegie Hall conducting debut in a performance of Verdi's *Requiem*. In May 2003, Dr. Kendrick again returned to Carnegie Hall with the SCSO to conduct a triumphant performance of Orff's *Carmina Burana*.

In July 2004, Conductor Kendrick led SCSO members and guests of the Sacramento State Choral Music Program on their first international European tour to Munich, Prague, Vienna and Budapest. In July 2006, Dr. Kendrick led the Sacramento Choral Society and guests from the Sacramento State Choral Music Program on a performance tour of China, with concerts in Beijing, Tianjin, Xian, Jinan (Sacramento's Sister City) and a special performance on the Great Wall. In 2008 he made his debut with the SCSO in LA's Disney Hall in a well-received performance of the Mozart *Requiem*. In 2009 he led the SCSO on a tour of Western Canada with performances in Victoria and Vancouver, British Columbia. In June 2013, Dr. Kendrick will tour with members of the SCSO to Italy with performances at St. Mark's Basilica in Venice, in Lucca, and on the Great Altar of St. Peter's (the Vatican) in Rome.


In addition, Dr. Kendrick is co-founder and former artistic director of the Sacramento Children's Chorus with conductor Lynn Stevens. The group celebrated its 20th anniversary this season on stage with the SCSO with a new jointly commissioned work by Randol Alan Bass for the Wells Fargo Home for the Holidays performance in December 2012.

Dr. Kendrick is also Director of Choral Activities at Sacramento State University where he conducts the Chamber Choir, the Women's Chorus and the University Chorus. He also

directs the Graduate Degree Program in Choral Conducting that he initiated in 1986. His Sacramento State Choirs have performed in Europe, the United States and Canada, where they appeared on an international telecast at the invitation of the Prime Minister of Canada. In May 2004, he received the Sacramento State School of the Arts Outstanding Community Service Award for his work in linking the community to the University. Dr. Kendrick was recently named Outstanding Teacher of the Year by the Capitol Section of the California Music Educators Association (CMEA).

Dr. Kendrick is also Organist and Director of Music at Sacramento's Sacred Heart Church where he conducts *Vox Nova* and *Schola Cantorum*. The latter ensemble has recorded eight CDs and has toured throughout North America, Spain, England, Italy and Austria. In February 2005, *Schola Cantorum* was selected to perform at the National Convention of the American Choral Directors' Association in Los Angeles at the new cathedral Our Lady of the Angels. In June 2007 Dr. Kendrick toured Italy with Sacred Heart's *Schola Cantorum* where they performed at a Papal Audience for Pope Benedict XVI and at St. Peter's (The Vatican) on the Great Altar. He also led Schola on a concert tour of Austria in June 2009 with performances in Vienna, Graz and Salzburg. Dr. Kendrick plans to return to Italy with Schola in June 2013 for performances in Rome, Florence and Venice.

Ryan is a graduate of McGill University in Montréal where his teachers were John Grew and William Porter. His studies have taken him to Holland, France, and Italy and he has also competed in international competitions in Dublin and Kotka, Finland. He is an avid recitalist and is known for his skills as an organ improviser.

Ryan served as Organ Scholar and Assistant Organist of Christ Church Cathedral in Montréal and was Director of Music and Organist of St. Phillip's Church in Montréal West. He played continuo for the Eastman Collegium Musicum and various chamber music ensembles. His passions outside the musical world range from bicycling and swimming to discovering the beauty of Northern California's natural landscapes.




