President's Message

Welcome to *Milestones: Our Journey Continues*, the Sacramento Gay Men's Chorus' 30th Anniversary Concert! May of 1985 is when our founders held their first public concert; coincidentally it was across the street at St. Paul's Episcopal Church. Since that time, SGMC has worked tirelessly to create meaningful music while forging connections to the community at large.

The Chorus was founded in mid 1984 as a singing group that aimed to foster a sense of community and provide a musical outlet for the LGBT community in the Sacramento area. As times have changed, our musical style has evolved, but our core mission of building harmony through music has stayed the same.

Among the milestones we are celebrating tonight is our long history of sharing the stage with local musicians and singers. Over the past thirty years, we have sung at numerous fundraisers for local non-profits such as My Sister's House, The Lavender Library, and Francis House. Other community performances were civic milestones, such as singing for State Treasurer Betty Yee's inauguration, or singing The National Anthem at the State Capitol when the U.S. Supreme Court overturned Proposition 8.

We were there for our own families when, during the AIDS epidemic, we sang for the funerals of countless gay men lost to AIDS.

And tonight, we are supporting Sierra Forever Families, one of Northern California's largest adoption and foster care agencies, who will receive a portion of tonight's ticket proceeds.

It takes our staff, singers and volunteers a great deal of time, money, and passion to create our themed concert events. Our singers have dedicated countless hours in rehearsal time since January. Our volunteers have worked tirelessly to make tonight's show come to life. Like most non-profits, SGMC would not survive without the amazing support of our family of donors.

Lynn Stevens, artistic director, conductor and co-founder of the Sacramento Children's Chorus, has more than thirty years experience in teaching choral music to children. Ms. Stevens received a Bachelor of Arts in Music from the University of Southern California, and a Master of Music in Choral Conducting from California State University, Sacramento. It was during her master's program that Ms. Stevens co-founded the Sacramento Children's Chorus with Dr. Donald Kendrick, 22 years ago.

Ms. Stevens conducts the SCC Cappella, the high school choir; Cantoris, the advanced touring choir; and Cantus, the intermediate choir. Ms. Stevens is also on the faculty of the music department at CSUS teaching choral conducting. She has led SCC touring choirs internationally in Sweden, Norway, British Columbia, England, France, Czech Republic and Hungary, and nationally in Honolulu, Los Angeles, Eugene OR, and New York City (Carnegie Hall). In the Summer of 2013, she lead the SCC choir to China.

Helen Mendenhall, *Principal Accompanist*

Helen Mendenhall, principal accompanist, has been with SCC for 21 years. Ms. Mendenhall performs frequently as a soloist, and is sought after accompanist at the piano, organ and continuo for a wide variety of soloists and ensembles. She received a Bachelor of Science in Music from George Fox University and a Master of Arts from California State University, Chico. Ms. Mendenhall taught music in public schools for more

than ten years and has held many church music positions including organist/pianist for Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd in Sacramento and choir director at Red Bluff Presbyterian Church. In addition to her responsibilities with the SCC, Ms. Mendenhall teaches piano and organ in her private studio. Ms. Mendenhall also teaches the SCC program, Music Makers.

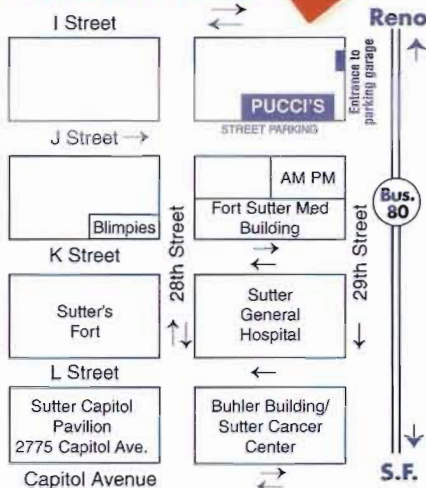
