Soloist: Nathan Halbur

A carol-anthem set to an anonymous 15th century poem about the the birth of Jesus and the purity of Mary his mother.

The Equivalence Principle (2015) - Nathan Halbur

A setting of Albert Einstein's statement of the equality of inertial and gravitational mass, one of the fundamental tenets of general relativity.

Go Home (2015) - Holly Laessig, Jess Wolfe; arr. Nathan Halbur

Soloist: Grace Gordon

Originally released by the band Lucius on their eponymous 2012 EP.

Featuring: The Men of DCC

Soloists: Austin Berbereia, Drake Jones

A traditional Scottish song first published in 1841, referring to the largest

freshwater loch (lake or sea inlet) in Scotland.

Seven Bridges Road (2008) – Stephen Young; arr. Philip Lawson Featuring: Grace Gordon, Kelly Chang, Ashley West, Lisa Bell, Chad Licup, Drake Jones, Russell Hawkins, Dylan Scalzo, Dean Watson, Bailey Cooke

Originally released by Steven Young on his 1969 album *Rock Salt & Nails*. Arranged by the long-time baritone and principal arranger for English vocal ensemble The King's Singers.

Bohemian Rhapsody (2006) – Freddie Mercury; arr. Philip Lawson Featuring: Mira Huang, Kelly Chang, Leila Hoenicke, Austin Berbereia, Russell Hawkins, Bailey Cooke

Originally released by the band Queen on their 1975 album A Night at the Opera. Also arranged by Lawson of The King's Singers.

The Long Day Closes (1868) - Arthur Sullivan

Featuring: Ashley Arias, Angela Yam, Lisa Bell, Carol Liu, Steven Ilagan, Eric Quintanar, Nathan Halbur, Sam Shipman

A part song, with lyrics by Henry Fothergill Chorley and music composed by Arthur Sullivan, best known for his long collaboration with W.S. Gilbert.

Through the house give glimmering light (1897) – Amy Beach Featuring: The Women of DCC

Set to text from William Shakespeare's play A Midsummer Night's Dream. Beach was the first successful American female composer of art music.

Entrée

All Night, from The Lotus Lovers (2011) - Stephen Paulus

Set to (translated) classical Chinese poetry from the 4th century CE know as Tzu-yeh Songs.

City Called Heaven (2016) – Traditional; arr. Maddy Pettit, Stephen Manga Soloist: Maddy Pettit

A traditional Negro spiritual.

Water Night (1996) - Eric Whitacre

Set to poetry by Octavio Paz, and featuring many dense cluster chords, made up of as many as 14 unique pitches at a time.

A Nightingale Sang in Berkeley Square (1980) – Manning Sherwin; arr. Gene Puerling Soloist: Alicia Allen

Lyrics by Eric Maschwitz. This arrangement was recorded by The Manhattan Transfer, and won the 1981 Grammy awared for Best Vocal Arrangement.
